VOLUNTARY PATROLLERS RULES & REGULATIONS

The purpose of the Florida Blockwatch is NOT to physically engage criminals but to increase visibility and report suspicious activity to the Florida SAPS.

1. The Patrollers personal safety ALWAYS comes first.
2. Whilst on Patrol you must always have your vest on, with your ID card clearly displayed, the Florida SAPS may stop you and request to see your ID card. This is to ensure that no fraudsters are making use of the Florida Blockwatch to commit a crime. In the event of you noticing a criminal act being perpetrated, e.g. Mugging, housebreaking, you MUST NOT physically engage the criminals, you are to report it directly to the Sector Police (numbers provided on the Emergency Numbers List) and move to a safe distance away from the scene.
3. Preferably a patroller should NOT leave their vehicle while on patrol, remain inside the vehicle and if something has caught your attention drive back around and if it still looks suspicious contact the Sector Police.
